Proficiency can be demonstrated by passing an examination equivalent to 3-9 hours and/or completing 3-9 hours of foreign language. Only the third semester equivalent course (3 credits) will be applied to the total number of hours required for graduation. Six (6) hours of proficiency, above the third semester will be viewed as acceptable electives for licensing.

If a student completes ENGL 10600, s/he completes five (5) credit hours of electives.

If a student completes ENGL 10800, s/he completes six (6) credit hours of electives.
