Psychology and Sociology are areas that can be added to the Social Studies original license by either successfully completing the prescribed program or passing the content examination. **NOTE: One Exception – if an individual holds a degree in History, Historical Perspectives may stand alone on a license for Transition to Teaching program completers.**
